Introduction

As part of the PhDICTKES project, WP 2.4, we have added an activity that focus on interaction with Kosovo and Kosovo diaspora and industry representatives. The conference aimed at sustaining the outcomes of PhDICTKES project, by further strengthening the relationship with academic diaspora and national industry representatives.

Conference participants

The participants that attended the first day of the conference were fifty-six (56) in number and approximately half of them (26) continued also during the second day. Most of the participants had a university affiliation, ten were from business and industry, or business associations. Six participants were affiliated to governmental organizations, such as Ministry of Education, Science, Technology and Innovation, Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Diaspora, Prime Minister Office, and Pristhina Municipality. In addition, the Minister of Information Society and Administration of the Republic of North Macedonia attended as well as the representative for Swedish Embassy in Kosovo. A couple of the company attendees were Kosovars who had a company of their own which was placed in other countries.

Program

The conference was held during two days of which the first day focused on academic interaction and benefits of developing collaboration between diaspora and Kosovo Higher Education Institutions. The first day was hosted at UBT Innovation Campus in Lipljan, Pristhina. The Rector of UBT gave welcoming speech and introduced the Mr. Lulezon Jagxhiu - Advisor to the Prime Minister on Information Technology, who represented the Prime Minister Office. He gave a supporting talk for the initiative of establishing national research collaboration through research education and also praised the contributions that international scholars will bring, particularly the Academic Diaspora. The other representatives of the Kosovo partners, Rector Naser Sahiti and Vice-Rector Arsim Susuri, presented their role in this project and the expected benefits for their respective universities. Next speakers was Ms. Katja Holböll who represented the perspective of Sweden Embassy in Kosovo. The final speaker in the morning program was Ass. Professor Miranda Kajtazi, who represented the Kosovo Diaspora. She gave an insightful speech on her contribution to establishing the Network of the Albanian Scientific Community in Sweden and complimented the Kosovo Ambassador in Sweden for her support.

The day continued with a Round-table discussion on the impact of Albanian Diaspora for increasing the ICT research capacities and visibility of Kosovo Education System. The invited for this program item were the Kosovo university partners, representatives from Kosovo ministries, the Minister of the Republic of North Macedonia, and the Deputy Mayor of Prishtina Municipality. This panel discussion was succeeded by more informal discussions and networking on how to collaborate and raised very good ideas to be further developed. Finally, the first day







was closed with a networking session, which made it possible to let Kosovo Diaspora know and meet each other, while sharing their background and work that they are currently involved in.

The second day was devoted to industry-academy collaboration and included also international experience of the gains by such a collaboration. This day was hosted at the Innovation and Training Park (ITP) in Prizren. The Introductory remarks were given by UPZ representative Arsim Susuri and UBT representative Ermira Daka. Ass. Professor Bahtjar Vogel, Kosovo Diaspora and Network of the Albanian Scientific Community in Sweden, gave his experience of collaborating with business and industry in common research projects. This speech was followed by the perspective of the Kosovo Informatics Association, represented by Mr. Ridvan Bunjaku. The day continued by a panel discussion moderated by Ass. Professor Arianit Kurti, which focused on industry-academia collaboration. The panelists were representatives from international organizations and Kosovo organizations that had some interest/insight into this kind of collaboration. The second day also ended with thematic discussions on joint initiatives and networking. As experienced during the first day, these presentations and discussions raised further ideas for continued collaboration.

Outcome – Proposal of Ideas

Below is a list of proposals to be further developed, which would initiate, maintain and strengthen the collaboration between Kosovo universities, academic dispora, and national industry.

- 5. Credit Internships (15 or 30 Credits)

- 7. Yearly workshop for PhDs in Kosovo with the PhDs from Kosovo studying in other Countries
 - Knowledge Sharing
 - Creating Networks
 - Potential for Concrete Joint Projects
 - Potentially Strengthening quality for the national PhD School from International Input/Influence
- 8. Mixed supervisor teams with Local Professors, International + Industry /Public Institutions for PhD Students
 - Different Perspectives
 - Different Competences
- 9. Learn from the National MIT Research School in Sweden
